### **Enrichment Center**


- Provided a myriad of resources for families, educators, service providers and health care professionals

## Therapeutic Garden

#### **DOWN TO EARTH - NEW!**

DSNetwork added a new community and therapeutic gardening program in 2023 with over 50 total participants every Sunday morning during planting and harvest seasons. We have six dedicated and irrigated plots in the Spaces of Opportunity community garden in South Phoenix. This program open to all ages and focused on teens and adults with Down syndrome to try their hand at farming, to be a little more self-sufficient, to learn something and connect with nature and others. Learning about plants and gardening teaches people about the earth and life cycles, how to grow food, how to appreciate healthy foods and change nutrition habits, environmental awareness, hands-on life skills experience, and much more. With so many benefits, gardening truly has the power to transform, regardless of age or ability.




